That's all it took for Don Anders to shift his attention from a surface-mining operation turned reclamation ranch to his future best friend, wife and life partner—Diana.

A Pittsburgh native, Don—a Human Resources Manager for Sunoco—was tasked with assisting in a cattle drive to relocate a herd from their summer grazing spot to prove grass-fed beef operations were sustainable on reclaimed mine lands.

Diana, an avid animal lover and Colorado resident, was working for Energy Fuels—a uranium mining company—and also had an opportunity to participate in the cattle drive.

Planning for the future

“It was like *City Slickers*,” joked Don. Two years later, they married, and Diana relocated to the East Coast and they settled in Exton. Raised by her German immigrant parents and fully bilingual, Diana shared she was “looking for someone kind like my father Helmut... and that’s Don!”

Fast-forward four decades, two sons, and four grandchildren (and one on the way) later; the Anders explored retirement living options and settled on Tel Hai. Enrolling in the Ready-Set-Go Program and waiting 3 years for their Woods Edge Cottage, “Our house was listed and sold within 1 hour on the market... we knew it was meant to be,” shared Don.

In choosing a Life Plan Community, both Don and Diana felt secure in the promise of the continuum of care, which includes preferred access to personal care, memory support and nursing services.

Diana was diagnosed five years ago, at age 66, with early onset dementia.

“My mother and father both had dementia. My father lived with us for 9 months, and we don’t want our kids to go through that,” she shared while reflecting on the challenging nature of providing care and safety while experiencing extreme caregiver fatigue. “Our choice to move to Tel Hai is about giving our children a gift... the gift of a plan.”

“We needed to have a plan in place for Diana, and for my peace of

mind in knowing she would be well cared for if I pass first,” shared Don. “We know there will be bumps in the road, but we wanted to plan now for the future ahead.”

This plan also includes support services for Don, who attends the Care Partner Support Group, coordinated by Tel Hai’s Resident Services Coordinators. Don has access to dementia resources, planning services, and equipping skills in responding to current and future needs of Diana’s, to keep her safe and secure.

As Diana’s diagnosis journey progresses, she feels “blessed by relationships with family and friends. I feel supported and have the time and ability to live independently now, and I want to do what I can, as long as I can.”

Living in the present

Reflecting on their first few months at the *Hill of Life*, Don stated, “We’re happy. We’ve only been here a short time, and we feel well connected and enjoy being a part of this community. We’re secure in our choice.”

Attending St. Mark’s Episcopal Church in Honey Brook, the Anders are living in the present by focusing their time, talents and energy on purposeful activities that are enriching their lives and the lives of others.

As a United States Army veteran, Don is instrumental in Vets Helping Vets, a local, veteran-run charity that raises funds for local veteran families in need during the holiday season, and provides support to the Lincoln’s Promise Food Pantry, a collaborative effort with the Coatesville Veterans Affairs Medical Center.

Diana—a passionate reader, writer and poet—loves to share her joy of reading through Reading Buddies, a cooperative program to assist individuals like children and seniors who require reading or vision assistance. She led in the creation of a reading program at St. Martha’s Manor in Downingtown, pairing friends with residents in need.

“I would love to duplicate a program like that here at Tel Hai... and doggie companionship! I’d love to organize a group of people who love dog walking where we can help our neighbors by providing visitation and dog-walking services,” she said.

both Don and Diana are challenged to achieve. Diana recently participated in a two-year Cassava Sciences clinical medication trial on a novel, small-molecule drug which was seeking FDA approval. The goal was to slow the progressive nature of the disease, but the drug trial was unsuccessful.

Taking advantage of their precious time together, the Anders are looking forward to heading south in February for a cruise through the Caribbean and the Panama Canal.

Diana is determined to power on as long as she is able. “I’m changing the world one hug at a time,” she shared. A personal motto that is both poignant and self-reflective—indicative of Diana’s bravery and her joyous outlook.

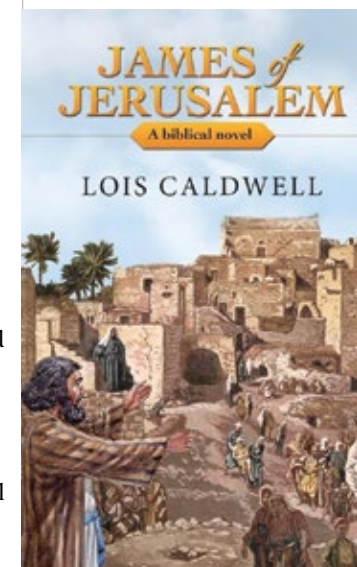

Unfortunate Historical Social Lessons: Part 3—Trouble in Paradise

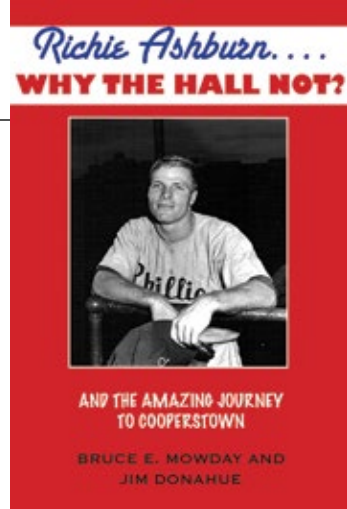
Monday, March 24, 2:15 PM

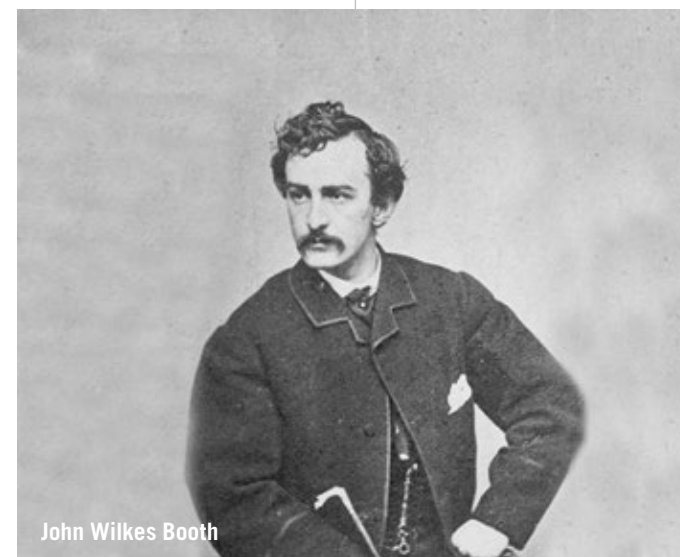


Women at the Valley Forge Encampment

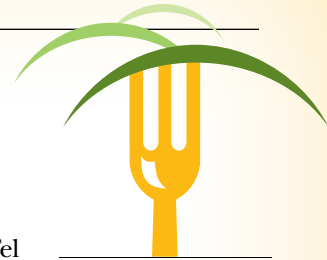
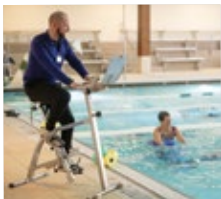
